programs also include how to get your patients to health, treatment planning and case

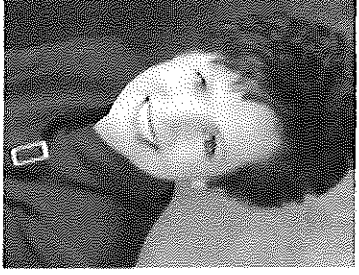
presentation. Dianne has been published in the Illinois Dental

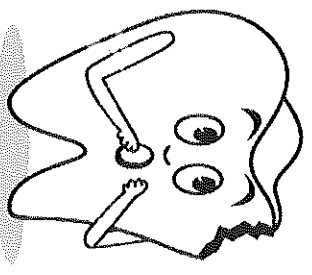
