Certificate Program

Central Community College offers a 12 Credit Hour Truck Driver Training Program that is based on the U.S. Department of Transportation requirements for training and licensure of commercial truck drivers. This 6-week program offers training in semi tractor-trailer combinations and includes 240 hours of instruction both on a closed driving range and over-the-road driving under the supervision of a licensed professional trainer. Students will also be provided instruction in vehicle maintenance, driver responsibilities, laws and the rules and regulations of the trucking industry.

Descriptions of these course are included in the Central Community College catalog under the Truck Driving heading. The fees and curriculum are subject to change at any time to assure that it continues to meet Department of Transportation requirements.



Program Costs

The tuition and fees for the six-week program include the required drug screen, DOT physical, driving fees, and course materials. Additional tuition will be added for students who are non-residents of Nebraska. Enrollment in the program is limited, so a deposit is required to reserve a position in the class. Limited housing is available for an additional fee. Payment options include cash or credit card payment, industry sponsorship or other agency support. All financing arrangements must be in place prior to the start of class.

Most OTR Trucking companies will offer tuition reimbursement with an employment contract.

Qualified students may find assistance through other government agencies such as: Workforce Development • Vocational Rehabilitation • Veterans administration

Licensure

Program graduates receive 12 college credits and earn a Professional Truck Driver course certificate. The program prepares students to take the Nebraska Commercial Drivers License test. CCC has nearly a 100 percent success rate among program completers earning their Commercial Drivers License (CDL).

Requirements

You must be 18 years of age for intrastate driving and 21 years of age for interstate driving. Companies have strict guidelines for driving records and will request a driver report from the state DMV.

Placement

The trucking industry has shown considerable interest in recruiting from the Central Community College Truck Driving program, and graduates have been highly successful in finding jobs. Starting salaries have ranged from \$35,000 to \$40,000 a year.
