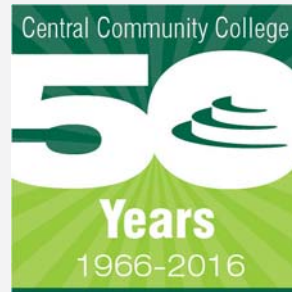

Nursing Assistant:

This course is designed to train the beginning Nursing Assistant to provide safe, effective and caring service to residents of a Long Term Care Facility.

The nursing assistant course is a lecture/lab. Students are expected to complete all hours of course to pass. The state of Nebraska requires that all students attend a minimum of 76 hours of class/lab time. Students need to complete the course work and hours within the 4-week time frame.

Cost: \$395.00 includes tuition, books and fees and State Test. State Testing: Date to be determined after class is over.

MINIMAL QUALIFICATIONS OF A NURSING ASSISTANT

- Ability to lift at least 80 pounds alone and up to a 250-pound man with help.
- Ability to read on a high school level.
- Ability to take and pass a written exam with 70% or better dealing with topics such as anatomy/physiology, functions of a NA, resident's rights, stages of death, medical terminology and abbreviations, etc.
- Ability to pass a clinical exam consisting of actual demonstrations of nursing procedures to a RN tester.
- Ability to work independently with minimal supervision.
- Ability to follow instructions and maintain emotional stability.
- No prior history of criminal activity or arrests.
- Ability to prove that one can carry out resident care without injury or harm to the resident or to self-especially during transfers, lifts, and position changes.
- A love and concern for the dignity and value of a person who requires total care and help in activities of living.
- Must successfully complete, within 120 days of employment, a Basic Resident Care Course approved by the Department.
- Must be 16 or older.
