The courses listed below are meant to serve as a sample of courses that are accepted under each requirement. A few courses have been approved in more than one category. However, a student may not use one course to meet more than one requirement.

Many courses have prerequisite requirements. You are responsible for checking whether or not you have met the prerequisites for the electives you choose.
