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MEET THE STAFF

The Director of Residence Life (DRL)

...lives on campus in the Clay Hall and is responsible for daily operations.

Resident Life Coordinator (RLC)

...serves as professional staff and assists with daily operations.

Residence Assistants (RAs)

...are students who live in each hall and are under the direction of the DRL. The residence hall staff is here to encourage and assist you. Should you have questions or concerns, please speak with an RA, RLC or the DRL.

ROOMMATE ASSIGNMENTS

The Housing Office assigns each student a roommate. Roommate selection is determined from the information noted on the Housing and Dining Contract, and the Housing Questionnaire.

Due to the limited space, we encourage you to contact your roommate to avoid duplication of personal furnishings.

Residents who are not satisfied with their roommate or room assignment must speak with the Director of Residence life. One room/ roommate change will be granted after the second week of the semester, if space is available.

Roommate requests are honored when possible and only if both students have made a mutual request.

Where should I go to check-in?

First, head to the Gym in the Dawson Building. This is where you'll check that all your paperwork, housing deposit, and other requirements are complete. You'll find staff from Financial Aid, Student Accounts, and Housing there to help you with anything you still need to take care of.

Once you've finished checking in at Dawson, you can go to your assigned Residence Hall. There, you'll get your check-in packet, keycard, and other important info. You'll also meet your RA team—they're excited to welcome you and help you get settled!

RESIDENCE HALL MEETINGS

Residence hall meetings are scheduled as needed. It is mandatory for residents to attend these meetings. Residents who are not able to attend must contact the Housing Coordinator and make other arrangements. It is the student's responsibility to find out the information they missed. A \$25 fine will be issued to residents who miss meetings without notifying the Residence Life Coordinator.

LOFT BEDS

Only lofts provided by the college are allowed in the residence halls. A loft is a structure similar to a bunk bed, used to raise a bed over the top of another piece of furniture (usually a desk or a couch).



ROOM REFRIGERATORS

Refrigerators must not exceed the following specifications: power 115 volts, 60 cycle AC, 50 watts, 6.0 amp, UL approved, and approximately 5.2 cubic feet. The College is not responsible for damage to the refrigerator or spoilage of the contents caused by electrical power failure or equipment malfunction. All cleaning and cost of damage or repair to the room or furnishings are the residents' responsibility.



CENTRAL GALLEY

Your dining service is managed by Chartwells Dining Service, a nationwide food service firm. Chartwells works closely with the College and you to provide a variety of nutritious menu options combined with personalized service for a pleasant dining experience. All students living in the residence halls must participate in the meal plan. The Central Galley is located in Hall Student Union. You may utilize a meal exchange over at the Commissary if you choose not to eat in the Central Galley. You can find the Central Galley and Commissary hours, along with menu items, at www.ccnneb.edu/campus-dining.

Please bring special dietary needs to Chartwells' attention. They will be more than happy to create a special diet that meets your needs or doctor's orders.

A to-go box will be provided for students with a conflicting class schedule or those who are employed during meal periods if you make arrangements with the Housing Office. If you are ill and unable to make it to the Central Galley, please contact your Housing Coordinator/and Housing Office. They will contact Chartwells to have a carry-out meal prepared for you.



CABLE TV

All residence hall rooms and lounge areas are provided with basic cable service. Students must provide their own TV and cable cords.

200 Meal Plan

Residents who choose this option will get 200 meals per semester. Additional meals can be purchased if necessary.

Students must apply to stay during Thanksgiving and Spring breaks. Student must have a **VALID** need to stay on campus during breaks due limited staffing and services. Please plan ahead for **ALL BREAKS** now. It is your responsibility to make arrangements to leave by the time of closing ahead of time. **All Residence Halls are closed at the end of fall semester.** It is the responsibility of the student to find their own housing during these times. In most cases, the Residence Halls close at 5:00 p.m. the last day of classes before a break, and reopen at noon the day before classes resume.

ITEMS NOT ALLOWED IN THE *Residence Halls*

In order to provide for the safety and security of our residents, some items aren't allowed in the residence halls. Please do not bring any of the following items with you when you move in.

1. Alcohol or drugs **(including signs or paraphernalia)*
2. Tobacco, Nicotine and Vaping Products *(including signs, decorations, or paraphernalia)*
3. Weapons and firearms **(including paintball guns, water bead guns, and knives)*
4. Large stereo speakers and/or sub-woofers
5. Electric Blankets
6. Cooking appliances (other than microwave)
7. Space Heaters
8. Bleach
9. Halogen Lamps
10. Candles, incense or other open flames *(Wax melts and plug-in air fresheners are NOT allowed)*
11. Pets
12. Extension cords of any kind
13. Nails or anything that will do permanent damage to the walls *(ONLY painter's tape and Command™ Brand Hooks/Strips are allowed to hang items.)*
